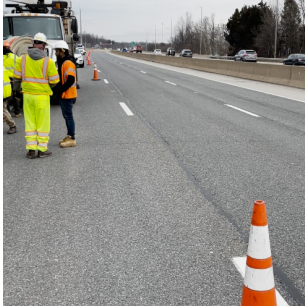




1. Confirm that appropriate traffic control is in place to ensure a safe working environment for personnel and equipment.



2. Visually inspect the top of the trench drain for any blockage.



3. Remove the 4 bolts in the Access Channel with a 15 mm socket.

Lift the grate to gain access to the internal round opening of the trench drain.



4. Insert vacuum hose and 360° pressure jetting hose from vacuum truck into the access channel opening.

5. Move the jetting hose forward through the interior of the trench drain to loosen any debris. Then retract the hose while keeping the jetting system active.

Depending on the amount of debris, this process may be performed repeatedly until the trench drain is clear.

Once complete, remove the hoses.



6. Flush debris from the outside of the channel.



7. Clear the grate frame of debris and bolt the grate to the access channel.



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
